

St. Vincent School Accreditation

This week, March 12-14, St. Vincent de Paul School will be visited by the Missouri Chapter of the National Federation of Non-Public Schools State Accrediting Association. This on-site review takes place approximately every fives years at each Diocesan school.

A big part of the reaccreditation process has been a year-long, in-depth self-study conducted by the school community. The criteria evaluated during this self-study process included mission statement and philosophy, instruction, curriculum, facilities, school climate, personnel and leadership, Catholicity, services, and more.


Five team members representing the State Accrediting Association will be in the St. Vincent School building during this time to evaluate the self-study work for the purpose of reaccrediting St. Vincent de Paul School. At the conclusion of the evaluation, the visiting team will compile a report from their findings. The report will be presented and a list including areas for suggested improvement and areas of commendation will be given. Information from the report will be used by the school community to develop a five-year action plan for St. Vincent School.

St. Patrick's Day Dispensation Issued by Bishop Rice

Given the penitential nature of the Season of Lent, the Bishops of the United States have preserved in the dioceses the tradition of abstinence from meat on each of the Fridays of Lent, "confident that no Catholic Christian will lightly hold himself excused from this penitential practice" (National Conference of Catholic Bishops, Statement, Nov. 18, 1966, n. 13). The law of abstinence binds those Catholics who have completed the 14th year of their age (can. 1252). This year, the Memorial of Saint Patrick falls on **Friday, March 17, during the Third Week of Lent**. It is well-known that Saint Patrick's Day is a day of celebration for many American Catholics. Bishop Edward M. Rice therefore decrees that on Friday, March 17, 2023, all Catholics of the Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau, no matter where they may be, are, by his authority, dispensed from the obligation (can. 87 §1). It is not required that anyone make use of this dispensation. However, those who do wish to make use of it are encouraged to pray the Fourth Sorrowful Mystery of the Rosary for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

The Stations of the Cross are images of stories about the passion and death of Jesus Christ. Most of the stories which make up the Stations were drawn from Scripture, and others, such as Saint Veronica wiping the face of Jesus, were taken from tradition. The route traditionally held to have been taken by Jesus to his death at Calvary (Golgotha) in



Jerusalem is called the Via Dolorosa or the Sorrowful Way. The Stations were erected in local churches as a way of bringing this prayerful experience to those who could not travel to Jerusalem.

Stations of the Cross are celebrated in the church every Friday during Lent at 5:00 in Spanish and at 6:15 p.m. in English. Stations are also celebrated by the school children on most Wednesday afternoons at 2:00 p.m. Please join in this devotional prayer and make it a part of your Lenten journey.







This Week at Home

Look for the Prophets

Monday, March 13

Prophets are people specially chosen to be messengers of God's Word in their time and place. Our Scriptures tell story after story about the persistence of prophets and resistance to their message. Prophets often surprise us in their simplicity and ordinariness. Take a moment today to look for the prophets God has sent in the here and now. Open your heart to the message they offer. *Today's readings: 2 Kings 5:1-15b; Psalm 42:2, 3; 43:3, 4; Luke 4:24-30.*

70 x 7 Tuesday, March 14

Today's message cuts right to the heart. Forgiveness is hard. But it is a requirement of discipleship. Jesus calls us to forgive and forgive again. Take this command to prayer today. Whom do you still need to forgive? It might even be yourself. Write a letter to Jesus specifically naming whom you need to forgive, the reason, and ask for help to take the next step. *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 3:25, 34-43; Psalm 25:4-5ab, 6 and 7bc, 8 and 9; Matthew 18:21-35.*

Living Witnesses

Wednesday, March 15

Pope Francis reminds us that "all of us are called to offer others an explicit witness to the saving love of the Lord" (*The Joy of the Gospel*, 121). No matter our occupation or place in life, we are first and foremost teachers of our faith. We teach with our words, but even more through our actions, gestures, and choices. Our ultimate purpose is to allow our life to speak the faith we carry within. This is how we give glory to God. *Today's readings: Deuteronomy 4:1*, 5-9; *Psalm 147:12-13*, 15-16, 19-20; *Matthew 5:17-19*.

Listen to My Voice

Thursday, March 16

The Lord commands, "Listen to my voice" (Jeremiah 7:23). The psalmist echoes, "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts (Psalm 95:7-8). The voice of the Lord that comes to us daily through the season requires our openness. While serious, challenging, and straightforward, our Lord clearly speaks the path of life for us. He tells us how to live, how to love, how to pray, how to give, how to forgive. Do you allow his voice to guide your life? Take these thoughts to prayer. *Today's readings: Jeremiah* 7:23-28; *Psalm* 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9; *Luke* 11:14-23.

St. Patrick Friday, March 17

Patrick and his monks ministered to the people of Ireland in the early fifth century. The monks based their spirituality on that of St. Jerome and St. Augustine, who affirmed that no person can walk without a guide. The monks practiced an early form of confessional counseling, inviting people to acknowledge their sins and repair the conduct of their Christian lives. This week marks the midpoint of Lent. How are you doing toward creating a clean heart? There is still plenty of time before Easter to seek the sacrament of reconciliation and make needed adjustments in daily choices. *Today's readings: Hosea 14:2-10; Psalm 81:6c-8a, 8bc-9, 10-11ab, 14 and 17; Mark 12:28-34.*

Cultivate Humility

Saturday, March 18

Humility is a virtue that exudes from our very being. The virtue is conveyed with our eyes, with our demeanor, and with our spirit, even before words reveal our true selves. A spirit of humility is cultivated through a life of gratitude for the blessings we have received and with sincere awareness of our dependence upon the generous giver of those blessings. There is always room to grow so we call upon the words of the psalmist in our daily prayer and ask for a humble spirit. *Today's readings: Hosea 6:1-6; Psalm 51:3-4, 18-19, 20-21ab; Luke 18:9-14.*

Sunday, March 12

God Sees Our Hearts

Today's readings: Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42. The Third Sunday of Lent marks the midpoint on our journey from Ash Wednesday to Holy Week. Day by day the invitations to turn our hearts toward God and receive his gifts of mercy and love intensify. The midday encounter between Jesus and the woman of Samaria at Jacob's well amplifies the invitation extended on Ash Wednesday to "return to me with your whole heart" (Joel 2:12).

We can imagine Jesus approaching each new encounter seeking to intuit, "What does their heart need from me?" Jesus immediately perceived the deepest needs of the woman's heart and pivoted the conversation from physical thirst to spiritual thirst. His willingness to ignore the social norms of the time and speak to her with frank familiarity reminds us that God's invitation to relationship is for everyone, no matter our past, our gender, our ancestry, our place in life.

Jesus reveals his divine purpose to this outcast woman and offers her the hope of eternal life. Our second reading, from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans, echoes this remarkable promise, "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit that has been given to us" (5:5).

Throughout Lent, God summons us unceasingly. The woman at Jacob's well represents every one of us. When God looks deeply into your heart today, what spiritual thirst needs to be quenched?
