

Hospitality Committee Meeting



Campus Planning Update

Many parishioners have been asking about the work of the Campus Planning Team. Since the building of the new rectory and the razing of the old rectory two years ago, the Campus Planning Team has been meeting. The next project to be finished will be the parking lot to the south of the church. This is where the old rectory was located.

After working with the City of Cape Girardeau and using the expertise of Bowen Engineering, there is a plan to move forward in May. The City asked that the plan include an area for water retention. This retention basin will be in the backyard of the house at 2000 Woodlawn, which the parish was able to purchase in December. (Side Note: The 2000 Woodlawn House is being reserved for a religious community of Sisters who may arrive in the summer of 2024. Until the Sisters arrive, the 2000 Woodlawn House will be used for other purposes.)

This new parking lot will have space for approximately 50 vehicles. On the parking area closest to church, there will be handicap parking. This is adjacent to a new ramp that will lead to the side door of church.

If you want to review the design, a display of the new parking lot is in the gathering area of church. In a few weeks, the Campus Planning Team will update you about the possible plans for the De Paul Center (old Notre Dame building).

Low-Gluten Hosts for Holy Communion

Low-gluten communion hosts are available at all weekend liturgies to those suffering from Celiac Sprue disease. The hosts, made by the Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in Clyde, Missouri, contain 0.01% wheat gluten. They are accepted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (http://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/the-mass/order-of-mass/liturgy-of-the-eucharist/celiac-disease-and-alcohol-intolerance.cfm), and are recommended by the journal *Gluten-Free Living* as "perfectly safe" for sufferers of Celiac Sprue disease (Vol. 9, no. 1). The Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau has approved these low-gluten altar breads for use in the Diocese. During a weekend Mass, the minister having the consecrated low-gluten hosts will be in the center aisle on the left side. When you approach this minister, just indicate that you need one of these consecrated hosts.


Bulldogs at Busch

Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least **six months** in advance. (If you have been married before, an annulment may need to be done first.)

This Week at Home

Follow Acts

Monday, April 17

A reading from Acts is proclaimed on nearly each day of the Easter season. Written as a continuance of his Gospel account, Luke paints the broad strokes of the Church's development from the resurrection of Jesus to Paul's first imprisonment. Luke emphasizes the powerful role of the Holy Spirit in the formation of the Christian community and the spread of the Word of God. Read Acts through to gain a perspective of how this period unfolded. *Today's readings: Acts 4:23-31; Psalm 2:1-3, 4-7a, 7b-9; John 3:1-8.*

Everyone Had Enough

Tuesday, April 18

The early Christian community laid the groundwork for upholding the common good by placing their treasure in a common purse to be shared fairly across the community. As a result, everyone had enough. Religious communities and some other intentional Christian communities follow this practice to this day. The care for the whole community supersedes the wants of the individual. While this ideal may seem radical to our modern way of thinking, there is much to be learned. How can you more intentionally share from our wealth with the most vulnerable in society? *Today's readings: Acts* 4:32-37; *Psalm* 93:1ab, 1cd-2, 5; *John* 3:7b-15.

Walk in the Light

Wednesday, April 19

During the Advent season as we await the birth of Christ, the prophet Isaiah announces, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Isaiah 9:1). Jesus himself proclaims, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). In today's Gospel reading, Jesus equates light with the eternal power of good and dark with the power of evil. As Christians, we are invited to walk in the light, to seek the truth, and to practice goodness. *Today's readings: Acts 5:17-26; Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9; John 3:16-21.*

Obey God

Thursday, April 20

When confronted by the temple leaders about their bold preaching, Peter and the apostles reply, "We must obey God" (Acts 5:29). The Latin root of the word *obey* means "listen" or "hear." This is powerful instruction for us today. There are so many loud and competing voices in the world. As Christians, we are charged to listen to the voice of God. Attending carefully to the preaching of the apostles in Acts and the speeches of Jesus in the Gospel of John will strengthen the words of truth in our hearts and help drown out all others. *Today's readings: Acts 5:27-33; Psalm 34:2 and 9, 17-18, 19-20; John 3:31-36*.

My Light and My Salvation

Friday, April 21

Our responsorial psalm for today captures the essence of Easter faith. We keep our eyes glued on the Lord throughout our earthly life with hope that we will rest in the house of the Lord for all of eternity. Carry Psalm 27 in your pocket, tape it on your bathroom mirror, and pray it daily until you have it memorized. It will carve a path to holiness. *Today's readings: Acts* 5:34-42; *Psalm* 27:1, 4, 13-14; *John* 6:1-15.

Miracles Abound

Saturday, April 22

We hear of two powerful miracles in today's readings. Acts relates that the number of those in Jerusalem coming to believe in Jesus "increased greatly" (Acts 6:7). John's Gospel recounts how Jesus rejoined the disciples in the boat by walking across the water. Which miracle stirs your heart more: the exponential number of people coming to faith or Jesus walking across the sea? Take it to prayer. *Today's readings: Acts 6:1-7; Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19; John 6:16-21*.

Sunday, April 16

Divine Mercy

Today's readings: Acts 2:42-47; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; 1 Peter 1:3-9; John 20:19-31. During the Jubilee Year of 2000, Pope John Paul II canonized Sr. Faustina Kowalska and declared that the universal Church would henceforth observe the Sunday after Easter as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. As we end the Octave of Easter, we are invited to contemplate the mystery of the resurrection in the light of God's infinite mercy. The richness of God's mercy radiates through today's Scriptures and especially in compassionate Jesus' response toward Thomas' unbelief. The gift of mercy is explicitly given when Jesus commissions his disciples ministers of divine mercy: "He breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose you retain sins retained" (John 20:22-23). Through entrusting the first disciples with the gift of forgiving sins, Jesus initiated a waterfall of mercy for all of humanity.

Sr. Faustina repeatedly heard a call to proclaim God's mercy to the world. She promoted the chaplet of divine mercy to raise spiritual awareness of God's mercy. Today, many Catholics will visit shrines devoted to divine mercy and pray the chaplet of divine mercy. Our Church announces to the world that God is merciful and that we are invited to rest in his loving embrace. May our hearts grow more aware of the mercy of God in our lives. In turn, may we actively show mercy to those who need it most.


