



Campus Planning Update #2

I hope you have had an opportunity to review the plans, displayed in the gathering area, for the parking lot where the old rectory was located (south of the church). The construction plans for the parking lot have recently been completed. This project will also include new lights for that area.

After the parking lot has been completed, we will begin moving to the DePaul Center (Old Notre Dame building). As many of you know, when Notre Dame Regional High School relocated to the west of town on Route K (two miles west of I-55), the old Notre Dame was left vacant. Through the generosity of Wanda Drury, the parish was able to purchase the Notre Dame property. This included the high school building, the old Notre Dame Convent and the parking lot on the north side of the high school.

The old Notre Dame Convent has been used for various purposes. Many different groups have been able to meet there. It has housed Maxine's Sharable Wearables for a number of years.

The DePaul Center has been used for many events and activities over the past 23 years. Immediately, St. Vincent de Paul School was able to take over the gym and the concession area. That space has served our grade school well. Most recently, the old bleachers have been replaced with new bleachers which are safer. (NB: If you want to buy some of the old bleacher boards, they can be purchased for \$20 per board.)

Below the gym area is the old Notre Dame cafeteria. The kitchen space for the cafeteria needs new appliances. With that upgrade it has the capacity to be a great kitchen. The Campus Planning Team is looking for people to help design this kitchen space. If you are interested, please contact me at stvcapepadre@gmail.com or at 573-335-7667.

In addition to the kitchen rehab, there is space for an Event Center. This Event Center will be on the lower level of the classroom area. It will have approximately 6,000 square feet of space and will be large enough to hold any parish, regional, or Diocesan event. It could host a wedding or anniversary reception and could also house our famous Lenten Fish Fries. The space has much potential.

In a few weeks, another aspect of the rehab project will be highlighted regarding plans for the old Notre Dame building. Once again, these are only suggestions from the Campus Planning Team. In order for any of this to become a reality, the Parish Council, the Parish Finance Council, and you, as a parish member, have to reach a consensus to move forward. And, needless to say, moving forward will involve a Capital Campaign to raise significant funds for this project. So, let's pray to St. Joseph, the Master Carpenter, to guide us on the final Master Plan of this grand project!

This Week at Home

St. Joseph the Worker

Monday, May 1

Today marks the second special date the Church has set aside to lift up and honor St. Joseph, the earthly father to Jesus of Nazareth. As a carpenter, Joseph serves as a model for the virtue of work and provision for his family. He did this quietly, without drawing attention away from his spouse, Mary, or his son, Jesus. His steadfast faithfulness led him eventually to be named the patron of the universal Church. St. Joseph the Worker, pray for us. *Today's readings: Genesis 1:26-2:3 or Colossians 3:14-15, 17, 23-24; Psalm 90:2, 3-4, 12-13, 14 and 16; Matthew 13:54-58.*

The Father and I are One

Tuesday, May 2

Today's Scripture passage locates Jesus in the temple at Jerusalem, once again surrounded by his fellow Jews imploring him to explain himself. We can sense Jesus' exasperation with their lack of perception despite his many efforts to show and tell them his true identity. He concludes boldly, "The Father and I are one" (John 10:30). Take this essential truth to prayer today. Can you empathize with his contemporaries and their struggle to comprehend? *Today's readings: Acts 11:19-26; Psalm 87:1b-3, 4-5, 6-7; John 10:22-30.*

Feast of Sts. Philip and James Wednesday, May 3

Jesus is the way, the truth, and the path to life. Our key link to God the Father, Jesus came to show the way to experience a relationship with the One who desires to be with us. Through following Jesus to the Father, we also become key links in the relationship chain. The apostles Philip and James were some of the first links in this unbroken chain of those who call themselves disciples of Jesus. *Today's readings: 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; Psalm 19:2-3. 4-5; John 14:6-14.*

The Panoramic View

Thursday, May 4

The pairing of today's first reading and Gospel offers the aerial view of the plan of salvation. Paul paints the broad strokes of God's covenant with the people of Israel leading to Jesus. Jesus echoes his divine role when he claims that his purpose is the fulfillment of Scripture (John 13:18). Step back and take in the panoramic view to contemplate God's plan and our role in it as disciples in this time and place. *Today's readings: Acts 13:13-25; Psalm 89:2-3, 21-22, 25 and 27; John 13:16-20.*

In My Father's House

Friday, May 5

Chapter 14 of John's Gospel is often chosen for proclamation at the Mass of Christian Burial. The words of consolation, encouragement in faith, and promise of a place of rest with God for all of eternity are just the words many need to hear when grief is fresh and there is wonder about the care of our souls after death consumes our hearts. Jesus' assurance to his beloved disciples speaks to us today. Light a candle in remembrance of departed loved ones. Sit in prayer with this passage from John's Gospel. Filled with Joy

Saturday, May 6

Luke paints a picture of the disciples Paul and Barnabas as active evangelizers, "The disciples could not but be filled with joy and the Holy Spirit" (Acts 13:52). Pope Francis calls us to follow their example as missionary disciples. The most effective approach is exuding the contagious joy of our life in God. Practice joy today. Attend to how you radiate joy in your words, actions, and gestures. *Today's readings: Acts* 13:44-52; *Psalm* 98:1, 2-3ab, 3cd-4; *John* 14:7-14.

Sunday, April 30

Good Shepherd Sunday

Today's readings: Acts 2:14a, 36-41; Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6 (1); 1 Peter 2:20b-25; John 10:1-10.

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. As part of John 10 is proclaimed, we hear Jesus boldly claim his identity as the Good Shepherd. Since young children are especially drawn to this image of Jesus, faith formation programs explore it to help children discover the voice of God calling each of his sheep by name. This relational analogy of Jesus the Good Shepherd calling his flock by name to follow him through the sheepfold gate resonates deeply. Listeners to this reading can contemplate all the ways a shepherd cares for his sheep, provides for all their needs, protects them, seeks them out if they stray, and guides their paths. Children easily see themselves as the sheep and intuit that Jesus' offer of love, care, and protection is for each of us.

This analogy communicates God's unceasing desire to be close to us. God entered into humanity and became one of us so that we might know and believe the possibility of true relationship with him. God knows each of us. God knows every part of us. God calls each of us by name. He leads us in right paths and stays by our side as protector and provider.

Good Shepherd Sunday offers a beautiful opportunity to place ourselves in this rich image and discover anew that we are called and beloved by Jesus, our Good Shepherd.
