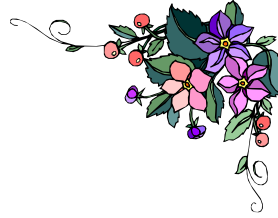

New Assignment in Addition to St. Vincent

Bishop Rice recently published new priest assignments for the Diocese of Springfield - Cape Girardeau. The assignments include Father Rick becoming the Parish Administrator of St. Michael Church in Fredericktown. Fredericktown is approximately 50 miles to the northwest of Cape Girardeau on Highway 72. The priest presently assigned there, Father Suresh Samala, is being assigned to the parishes in New Madrid and Caruthersville. Currently a priest is not available for Fredericktown. Therefore, this year the administration of the parish will be done by Father Rick. This responsibility will take place in addition to his pastoral ministry here at St. Vincent de Paul Parish. The new assignment will begin Saturday, July 1, 2023.

Please pray for all parishes affected by the new assignments taking place this summer. Also, pray for young men in discernment of a possible priestly vocation ... the harvest is great but the laborers are few! Pray for laborers in the Lord's field, especially from St. Vincent de Paul Parish!

Diocesan Development Fund

Campus Planning Update #3

Thank you for your attention to the Campus Planning Updates over the past few weeks. This is the third installment in this series of articles.

In the last update, I spoke about the DePaul Center (old Notre Dame High School) and the possibility of renovating the kitchen area. Continuing with that idea, the kitchen area in the DePaul Center is a nice large space. If we add the old boiler room to the existing kitchen space, the new kitchen would have ample room. There would be plenty of work space for any meal being prepared. If you would like to take a look at this kitchen area, I will be giving a tour on Saturday evening, June 3, at 6:00 p.m. and Sunday, June 4, at 12:00 noon.

The old student cafeteria would become meeting rooms and parish offices. In the current parish office, there is one small meeting room. So, by renovating the old cafeteria space, the plan is to provide adequate space for all parish staff. This would include offices for:

- Pastor
- Associate Pastor
- Receptionist
- Greeting space
- Parish Administrative Assistant (Bulletin Editor/Scheduling/Records)
- Parish Administrative Assistant (Virtus/Accounting)
- Parish Finance Director
- Parish Maintenance Supervisor
- Parish Director of Religious Education
- Parish RCIA Director
- Parish Homebound Ministry Coordinator
- Parish Youth
- Parish Social Media
- Parish Director of Liturgical Music
- Parish Event Center Director
- Parish Workroom
- Parish Archive and Record Room
- Parish Office Staff Break Room (lunch)
- Parish Office Restrooms
- Storage Room

In addition to the above, there would be space for at least three rooms that could hold approximately 20 people each. Of course, we want to make this space flexible, so it can be expanded from three rooms to one large room.

This takes care of the bottom floor of the DePaul Center. Future Campus Planning Updates will address:

- DePaul Gym and Stage Area
- Concession Area and Ramp to the North Parking Lot
- Second Floor and Third Floor of the Classroom Area
(above Event Center addressed in Campus Planning Update #2)
- Current Parish Office
- Old Convent near the Fairmount Cemetery
- Renovation of areas within the Grade School
- Church Worship Space

Once again, these are only suggestions from the Campus Planning Team. In order for any of this to become a reality, the Parish Pastoral Council, the Parish Finance Council, and you as a parish member, have to reach a consensus to move forward. And, needless to say, moving forward will involve a Capital Campaign to raise significant funds for this project. So, let's pray to St. Joseph, the Master Carpenter, to guide us on the final Master Plan of this grand project!

(Note: Some have asked if the Old Notre Dame bleacher boards are still available. Yes, they are. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements. They may be purchased for \$20 per board.)

Tuesday, May 30

With the end of our ninety-day journey from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost Sunday, the Church enters the season of Ordinary Time. Do not mistake this season for being *ordinary* as in *routine*. In this season, *ordinary* refers to *ordered* or *counted* time. The Church is now in the Eighth Week in Ordinary Time. The Visitation

Wednesday, May 31

In today's Gospel, we hear Mary proclaim the words of the Magnificat, which the Church prays as part of the Liturgy of the Hours every evening. Pray the Magnificat as part of your grace before meals or at the close of your day. *Today's readings: Zephaniah 3:14-18a or Romans 12:9-16; Isaiah 12:2-3, 4bcd, 5-6; Luke 1:39-56.*

St. Justin, Martyr

Thursday, June 1

Justin converted to Christianity in the second century after years of study, prayer, and reflection. A lover of philosophy and vocal defender of the faith, Justin was martyred for his steadfast adherence to Christianity. During your prayer time, remember all who received the initiation sacraments at the Easter Vigil and pray that they have the resilience to remain steadfast in their faith. *Today's readings: Sirach 42:15-25; Psalm 33:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 Mark 10:46-52.*

Growth during Ordinary Time

Friday, June 2

Ultimately, our Christian mission is to help others grow in an authentic and meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ. Each of us must be able to confidently answer Jesus' inquiry, "Who do you say that I am," with a conviction of faith. Take some time to look back over your spiritual journey since Ash Wednesday and then look forward to the coming weeks in Ordinary Time. How have you grown in your relationship with Christ through your daily attention to the Gospel and how do you hope to deepen your faith in the days and weeks ahead? *Today's readings: Sirach 44:1, 9-13; Psalm 149:1b-2, 3-4, 5-6a and 9b; Mark 11:11-26.*

Triune Unity

Saturday, June 3

Tomorrow the Church commemorates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This observance is a reminder that God desires to be close to us. God's ecstatic love for the world overflows in the gift of the Son and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We explicitly unite ourselves with the mystery of the holy Trinity every time we mark our bodies with the sign of the cross. Try to make the sign of the cross with more intentionality. Allow this gesture that we repeat so often to be a poignant reminder of our unbreakable unity with God. May your faith journey through Ordinary Time be abundantly blessed. *Today's readings: Sirach 51:12cd-20; Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 11; Mark 11:27-33.*

Sunday, May 28

Come Holy Spirit

Today's readings: Acts 2:1-11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; Sequence: Veni Sancte Spiritus; John 20:19-23.

With the celebration of Pentecost, we have traveled on a ninety-day journey since Ash Wednesday. Throughout Lent we watched for signposts in the Scriptures directing our hearts toward God. At Easter we committed (some of us for the first time and the rest of us once again) to our journey of faith in the risen Christ. As we journeyed through the weeks of Easter, Jesus continually beckoned us to remain close and promised to give us the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will bind us to one another and to God.

The promised gift of the Holy Spirit is affirmed on Pentecost. Before today's Gospel, we acclaim, "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love." The gifts of the Holy Spirit—wisdom, understanding, counsel, strength, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord—assure us that God is cultivating and nurturing us to life within him. We carry the Holy Spirit within us and radiate that Spirit to all we meet. With the Spirit dwelling within us, we are always close to God. Today this truth of our faith is celebrated!

Take time this week to note the gifts of the Holy Spirit that you depend upon the most. Pray for a strengthening of the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help you on your daily walk as a disciple of the risen Christ. Come Holy Spirit!
