Campus Planning Update #2

I hope you have had an opportunity to review the plans, displayed in the gathering area, for the parking lot where the old rectory was located (south of the church). The construction plans for the parking lot have recently been completed. This project will also include new lights for that area.

After the parking lot has been completed, we will begin moving to the DePaul Center (Old Notre Dame building). As many of you know, when Notre Dame Regional High School relocated to the west of town on Route K (two miles west of I-55), the old Notre Dame was left vacant. Through the generosity of Wanda Drury, the parish was able to purchase the Notre Dame property. This included the high school building, the old Notre Dame Convent and the parking lot on the north side of the high school.

The old Notre Dame Convent has been used for various purposes. Many different groups have been able to meet there. It has housed Maxine's Sharable Wearables for a number of years.

The DePaul Center has been used for many events and activities over the past 23 years. Immediately, St. Vincent de Paul School was able to take over the gym and the concession area. That space has served our grade school well. Most recently, the old bleachers have been replaced with new bleachers which are safer. (NB: If you want to buy some of the old bleacher boards, they can be purchased for \$20 per board.)

Below the gym area is the old Notre Dame cafeteria. The kitchen space for the cafeteria needs new appliances. With that upgrade it has the capacity to be a great kitchen. The Campus Planning Team is looking for people to help design this kitchen space. If you are interested, please contact me at stvcapepadre@gmail.com or at 573-335-7667.

In addition to the kitchen rehab, there is space for an Event Center. This Event Center will be on the lower level of the classroom area. It will have approximately 6,000 square feet of space and will be large enough to hold parish, regional, or Diocesan events. It could host wedding or anniversary receptions and could also house our famous Lenten Fish Fries. The space has much potential.

In a few weeks, another aspect of the rehab project will be highlighted regarding plans for the old Notre Dame building. Once again, these are only suggestions from the Campus Planning Team. In order for any of this to become a reality, the Parish Council, the Parish Finance Council, and you, as a parish member, have to reach a consensus to move forward. And, needless to say, moving forward will involve a Capital Campaign to raise significant funds for this project. So, let's pray to St. Joseph, the Master Carpenter, to guide us on the final Master Plan of this grand project! St. Joseph - Pray for Us!

This Week at Home

God First Monday, May 8

Our message for today is captured in the response to Psalm 115, "Not to us, LORD, not to us / but to your name give the glory" (115:1). Across all time people fall into the trap of worshiping false gods and the temptation has only grown with the emergence of social media and celebrity. The first commandment that God gave so long ago spells it out clearly. The first disciples and all those who follow are called to point the way to the Triune God. Attend to how you spend your time today and where you place your energy: Who or what do you place first in your life? If not God, is it time for realignment? *Today's readings: Acts* 14:5-18; *Psalm* 115:1-2, 3-4, 15-16; *John* 14:21-26.

Be Persistent

Paul and Barnabas demonstrate unstoppable persistence in their single-focused mission to bring the good news to all who will listen. They tenaciously give witness to all the ways God has accompanied and supported them through trials and tests. Our primary call as baptized Christians is to live in such a way that we are constantly giving glory to God. Small gestures count as much as large gestures. How do you give glory to God in the small details of your day? *Today's readings: Acts 14:19-28; Psalm 145:10-11, 12-13ab 21; John 14:27-31a.*

Remain Wednesday, May 10

God deeply desires to be close to us. Jesus reveals this desire when he proclaims that he is the vine and we are the branches. Read John 15:1-8 carefully and count how many times Jesus uses the word *remain*. Jesus ardently implores his disciples and all of us to remain close to him. We can see the closeness of God in the new spring growth of branches, leaves, and flower buds. Jesus uses the familiar image of the vine and the branches to help us visually comprehend the closeness he desires. He is the vine; we are the branches. Look for the signs of God in creation. Can you see them? *Today's readings: Acts* 15:1-6; *Psalm* 122:1-2, 3-4ab, 4cd-5; *John* 15:1-8.

Love and Joy

Thursday, May 11

Tuesday, May 9

Jesus' words to his disciples read like a Christmas card. He encourages them to know and feel the love of God that he knows with his Father. Place yourself in the room with the disciples. Jesus wishes this knowledge of love for each of us. Receive it as a gift and allow it to unwrap great joy in your heart. Follow his example and tell someone you love them today. *Today's readings: Acts 15:7-21; Psalm 96:1-2a, 2b-3, 10; John 15:9-11.*

Love One Another

Friday, May 12

Jesus' words move from invitatory to commanding. In this next passage from John's Gospel he tells the disciples straight out, "This is my commandment: love one another" (John 15:12). Parents say it to their children. Marriage counselors say it to husbands and wives. Pastors say it to parishioners. We are called to stick together as a family with love as the binding agent. Tack the commandment on a note card where you will see it over and over again. *Today's readings: Acts* 15:22-31; *Psalm* 57:8-9, 10 and 12; *John* 15:12-17.

Called and Chosen

Saturday, May 13

When walking as a disciple feels hard, remember the assurances Jesus offered to his followers in John 15:19, "I have chosen you." God calls and chooses us to be joyful and courageous witnesses in the communities where we are planted. We are not alone; God walks with us. Look for an opportunity to share your faith with someone new today. *Today's readings: Acts 16:1-10; Psalm 100:1b-2, 3, 5; John 15:18-21*.

Sunday, May 7

The Way, The Truth, The Life

Today's readings: Acts 6:1-7; Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19; 1 Peter 2:4-9; John 14:1-12.

When we read the words of Jesus with two thousand years of salvation history in our rearview mirror, it all seems clear. Jesus repeatedly tells the disciples exactly who he is, who sent him, and where he is going. He promises his disciples, whom he loved with human and divine power, that they will remain close for all eternity. Human death will not destroy the bonds of love and relationship.

This promise, first spoken to the disciples shortly after Jesus washed their feet, extends to believers across the generations as well. He offers a compass so that we can always stay close. "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). There it is: we remain close to God by remaining close to Jesus. Last Sunday, Jesus told us that he is the gate. Today he tells us he is the "way" and the "truth" and the "life." Follow his way. Believe his truth. And you will have life eternal.

At that moment of revelation, the disciples responded with questions and confusion. But with the advantage of knowing the full story, we can proceed with confidence, faith, and trust. In the opening prayer for Mass today, we ask God to "constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us" that we baptized Christians may "bear much fruit" in our lives and eventually "come to the joys of life eternal." Persevere in following the footsteps of Jesus, confident they lead to eternal joy with him.


